County Wide COVID-19 Update

The health department monitors the health of county residents. The following is an update to inform the community of the current status of the COVID-19 pandemic in Cowley County.

Respiratory infections in Cowley County are widespread and continue to effect local residents. This overall condition is expected to slowly improve over the next 4-6 weeks. All residents are encouraged to take all available precautions to avoid the contraction and spread of illness.

LOCAL SCHOOLS:

Local schools have reported some incidents of illness, but attendance is much improved from where we were one month ago. Expect illness to affect attendance centers through the next several weeks. Students that are showing symptoms of any illness should closely follow their school district policies for attendance. Contact your school RN if you have questions about COVID testing for local students.

The PHO continually reviews illness data from our community and will propose any changes as needed. As of this date the Joint Cowley County Board of Health in their meeting February 8, 2022, has approved the continuation of the 10-day isolation protocol for people who test positive for SARS-CoV2 in Cowley County.

COVID-19 TESTING:

During the past week testing requests have continued to decline county wide. We hope this pattern continues.

The Health Department is still providing testing and we have established new relationships with laboratories to have results returned rapidly. If you begin to feel ill you are advised to test to learn if you may have COVID in order to help stop the spread of illness. If you develop symptoms and need a test please contact the Winfield Office and staff will help you, detail the process, and get you scheduled.



COWLEY COUNTY ILLNESS REPORT BY THE NUMBERS:

The positivity rate for the last seven days has declined to 9.37%. Testing volumes continue to slow and are currently averaging fewer than 50 people per day in the county.

Since the start of the pandemic, nearly 9,930 COVID cases have been confirmed in Cowley County. Thus far in February 270 new cases have been reported. Two additional deaths were recorded this week connected to COVID infection in Cowley County. Overall, one hundred forty-seven (147) Cowley County residents have died from complications related to COVID-19 since March of 2020.




This chart compares the previous year, 2021 with the current year to date.
