WHAT'S NEW IN PUBLIC HEALTH?

TORNADO PREPAREDNESS

It's Tornado Season, so NOW is the time to prepare!

BEFORE A TORNADO

- Be Aware Stay informed through notifications, local news, or a NOAA Weather Radio.
- Have a Plan Know what to do before disaster strikes.
 Designate a room in your house to shelter such as a basement or interior room. Identify nearby safe buildings and public shelters that you can use.
- Be Ready If a tornado watch is issued, be prepared to evacuate to a safe shelter.

DURING A TORNADO

- Stay Weather-Ready Continue listening to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay informed.
- At Your House Get to your basement, safe room, or an interior room away from windows.
- At Work or School Follow your tornado drill and proceed to your tornado shelter quickly and calmly. Stay away from windows and do not shelter in large open rooms.
- Outside Seek shelter inside a sturdy building immediately if a tornado is approaching. Sheds and storage facilities are NOT safe.
- In a Vehicle Vehicles are NOT safe during tornados. The
 best course of action is to drive to the closest shelter. If you
 are unable to make it to a safe shelter, either get down in
 your car and cover your head, or abandon your car and seek
 shelter in a low lying area such as a ditch or ravine.

WORLD MALARIA DAY

April 25th is World Malaria, a day for recognizing the danger of mosquitoes and the serious diseases that they can transmit! While Kansas may not be home to malaria, the mosquitoes here can still spread some pretty serious illnesses like West Nile virus. So take these tips and keep yourself safe from mosquito bites!

APPLY INSECT REPELLANT

Insect repellants with ingredients like DEET are extremely effective at preventing mosquito bites.

AVOID PEAK MOSQUITO HOURS

Sunrise and sunset are the times when mosquitoes are most active.

PRACTICE MOSQUITO CONTROL

Eliminate any standing pools of water or other mosquito habitats around your home.

GATHER IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

Having key documents on hand can be very helpful. Be sure to gather copies of important documents including:

- Identification Documents Financial & Legal Documents
- Medical Information
- Contact Information

THE IMPORTANCE OF INSURANCE

Insurance coverage can help provide the funds to repair, rebuild, & replace property after a disaster! Here are some key things to keep in mind:

- Keep the essentials covered: Property, Health, & Life
- · Know your risk for different types of disaster.
- Document your property now! This can help immensely in filing claims after a disaster.
- Purchase additional coverage if necessary.

EMERGENCY KIT

- Besides necessities, you should also include copies of the important documents mentioned above
- Keep your documents in a waterproof & fireproof container and store it in a secure location!
- Include a small amount of cash in small bills (1s, 5s, 10s).
