Health Department Mobile App Feature Highlight

Request Appointments

Save time and cut down on paperwork by requesting appointments through the mobile app! Simply tap the Request Appointment button on the home screen and fill out the form. You'll receive a call to confirm your appointment and you'll be set! This feature is also available in Spanish as well!

Weather Forecasts and Alerts

Did you know you can check the forecast on the Health Department Mobile App? Simply tap the button in the upper left corner of the home screen to see the current weather conditions. Here you can also see today's hourly forecast and the 7-day forecast as well. Another neat feature is the ability to check the Doppler radar map for local, regional, and nationwide!

The mobile app will also receive alerts from the National Weather Service (NWS). With these alerts, you can stay up to date on the latest severe weather in your area! Tap the button in the upper right corner of the home screen and check the notification settings to enable NWS alerts.
